## **Brief Introduction to the Tourist Spots**

# Kampong Glam (Free)

Kampong Glam is a Muslim-populated area in Singapore, located northeast of Bugis MRT Station, adjacent to Victoria Street, JlnSultan and Beach Road. This is a great place to experience Malay and Islamic culture, with beautiful architecture, exotic shops and delicious and refined cuisine. There are many attractions to visit. The Sultan Mosque on Muscat Street is an iconic building in Kampong Glam, with an onion-shaped golden dome and a huge prayer hall, making it the largest mosque in Singapore.



# Gardens by the Bay (Ticket: 35USD per person)

## Chinatown (Free)

Legend has it that because Chinatown Singapore lacked running water in its early days, residents had to haul water in on ox carts, thus the area's Chinese name translates to "Ox Cart Water". Here travelers have the opportunity to taste a vast variety of delicacies and browse all kinds of affordable souvenirs. There are also tons of traditional-style buildings, like the Sri Mariamman Temple, Masjid Jamae and the Buddha Tooth Relic Temple and Museum.



# Merlion Park (Free)



Singapore's Merlion Park is a pedestrian area located just alongside the mouth of the Singapore River. Singapore's famous Merlion statue is located here. The half-lion, half-mermaid hybrid is the symbol of Singapore. Behind the original Merlion there is now a little Merlion cub which, along with the big one, also spits jets of water from its mouth.
